


Cantrell Primary School Newsletter 9th June 2023

DOGS ARE NOT ALLOWED ON THE SCHOOL SITE. A requirement by Nottingham City Council. We ask you not to bring dogs onto the school premises for any reason, whilst they may be family pets, some children are frightened of them and dogs can also react to the large numbers of young children at the start and end of the school day. There is also a health and safety risk if dogs foul the play areas.

NUT ALLERGY. We are continuing to pursue the status of 'Nut Free school' This means we cannot have any peanut based products in lunch boxes, including peanut butter sandwiches, bags of peanuts and chocolate bars with nuts e.g. snickers etc. We appreciate that some items may contain traces of nuts and we will do all we can to avoid these, but to protect those in school with severe allergies we would appreciate your support on specific nut-based products not being brought into school.

MAKE-UP. We do not allow children to wear make-up, or false nails, in school, in any year group, the only exception is school performances and special occasions where the makeup will be specified.

INTRODUCTION TO SHAKESPEARE. Next Half-term, EYFS will be introduced to A Midsummer Night's Dream and Key Stage 1 & 2 will focus on Twelfth Night. We continue to introduce our families to these two famous plays. Continued from last time. Eventually, Oberon lifts all the enchantments and puts the humans to sleep. Titania is horrified that she's been enamoured of an ass and is reconciled with Oberon. On waking, the lovers decide the night's events must have all been a dream. Lysander and Hermia are back to normal, and Demetrius admits he does love Helena after all. Bottom wakes up and recounts his 'strange dream'. The wedding of Theseus and Hippolyta becomes a triple celebration as the other human couples marry too. Quince and Bottom's troupe amuses the couples with their amateur performance of the play. As the couples retire, Oberon, Titania and the fairies perform a blessing, and Puck asks the audience to applaud if they enjoyed the performance.

CANTRELL'S READING CHALLENGE. Reading remains the school's top priority. We continue to encourage parents and children to develop their love of reading and understanding of why learning to read, and developing a love of reading, is important. The winning class with the highest percentage of children reading 4 times a week at home until **Monday**17th July. The winning class will be invited with their parents to a prize afternoon on **Friday 21st July.** The prize will be announced soon. Here is how you can help:

- Encourage and listen to your child/children to read their reading book
- Share a story with your child/children, encouraging questions and discussion about what they are reading or the illustrations
- Here is the most important thing sign your child's/children's reading diary (noting the book that they have read to you and include your signature) every time they read to you. It is important that children read to an adult, so reading to a brother or sister will unfortunately not be accepted. If the diary is not kept up-to-date, they will miss out on the opportunity to help their class win the Reading Challenge. Your child/children's class teacher will keep a record of how many times they read every week and they will check the diaries every Friday.

Nottingham Castle set to reopen on June 26. Nottingham Castle will reopen on Monday 26 June and will cost adults just £12 for entry as many times as they like in a year. Kids aged 15 and under will go free, making it an exceptionally good value family day out. It's going to be fantastic to have it back at the heart of our city's life. here's so much to see and do in the redeveloped site, including a new visitor centre and café, Hood's Hideout adventure playground, interpretative signage around the grounds to discover the lost medieval castle, along with galleries offering modern, interactive experiences.
