ATTENDANCE. Currently at 96.18% for the academic year so far, slightly above the Ofsted expected standard of 95%. Here are a few more top tips to help your child to enjoy, learn and achieve at school:

- Children get colds and headaches often but don't always need to miss a full day of school. Try getting them to eat something, drink plenty of water or if necessary, give a suitable medication according to packet or GP instructions. Contact school, before 8:40am, to advise us if your child is not well.
- If they feel better later on, bring them to school, even if they have missed the morning just give us a quick call to let us know when to expect you.

CAN YOU SPARE SOME TIME TO HELP WITH SECOND HAND UNIFORM? The school governors would like to see if there are any parents who could give some time to sort the large quantity of second-hand uniform that has been gathered over recent weeks. The plan would be to wash it in the school washing machine, dry and hang it on a rail with a view to organising a second-hand school uniform and distribution scheme. We will be leaving school at 1pm and travelling by tram for a 2pm start. We will return to school by 3:45pm. The children will need to be collected from the usual lines in the playground at this time, not from the front yard/gate. The children will need to come to school with a waterproof coat and sensible shoes as the weather at this time of year can be unpredictable. The children can also bring a water bottle with them to have a drink during the performance. Please ensure that any medication that is needed is in school.

READING REMINDER. Every Friday morning from 8:30am we will be opening our doors for family reading mornings until 8:45 when lessons start. This is the chance to come between 8:30 and 8:45am to spend 5 minutes sharing a book

with your child in the classroom. If you have more than one child then all go to one class one week and rotate to the next child's class the following Friday. You must accompany your child, you cannot just drop off early.

"The Role of the Co-Opted Cantrell School Governor"

The Cantrell School Governing Body are looking to appoint some additional co-opted governors. The information enclosed here tells you a little more about the role and commitment you would be making. If you are interested then please contact Ralph Surman at the school to arrange to meet with our Chair of Governors Andrew Moore, and Vice Chair Nicola Curzon. At this very informal meeting we will ask you to expand on the experience and skills you could bring to this role, provide you with more information and answer any questions.

What are co-opted governors at Cantrell expected to do?

All Cantrell school governors contribute to the work of the governing body in ensuring high standards of achievement for all children and young people in the school by: -

- Setting the school's vision, ethos and strategic direction;
- Holding the school to account for the educational performance of the children;
- Overseeing the financial performance of the school and making sure our money is well spent.

How are co-opted governors appointed?

A co-opted governor is a person appointed by the governing body, not by parental ballot, and who, in the opinion of the governing body, has the skills required to contribute to the effective governance and success of the school. As a co-opted governor, you may have an area of specialist knowledge or experience, or bring a wide range of skills and experience to your role as a governor.

As a co-opted governor, you act in the best interests of the school and wider community and cannot be mandated to take a particular stance on issues.

As an effective co-opted governor, you:

- Support the aims of Cantrell;
- Visit and get to know our whole Cantrell community;
- Work in partnership with the headteacher, senior leadership team and other governors to raise standards and improve outcomes for all children;
- Prepare for meetings by reading papers beforehand;
- Take responsibility for your own learning and development as a governor including by attending training;
- Attend six governing body meetings each academic year;
- Read briefings and newsletters for governors;
- Be loyal to the decisions made by the governing body;
- Respect the confidentiality of governing body affairs;
- Declare an interest and withdraw from any meeting where you, a partner or close relative or friend stands to gain, or where you are so close to a matter discussed it is difficult to be impartial;
- Have regard to the broader responsibilities as a governor of a public institution in regard to promoting accountability for the actions and performance of the governing body.
