

Cantrell Primary School Newsletter 3rd December 2021

ATTENDANCE. A slight drop to **94.04%** this week which is still below target. **285** children are '**In it to Win it**' so far. Children who are at school every day from 1st November until Christmas will receive an end of term prize!

CORONAVIRUS UPDATE. We have seen a rise in positive cases this week. Please remember that if your child, or someone in your household, develops symptoms then *you must self-isolate and seek a PCR test* bookable at <https://www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test>, or call **119**. There are local walk-through test sites at Duke Street car park in Bulwell (behind Iceland) and Southglade Leisure Centre. If you have one or more of these symptoms then you should not rely on Lateral Flow Device for a test result – you need to book a PCR test. The three main symptoms are: * a high temperature; * a new, continuous cough; * you've lost your sense of smell or taste or it's changed.

FREE SCHOOL MEAL VOUCHERS. Children entitled to free school meals as assessed by Pupil Benefits will be allocated supermarket vouchers to cover the Christmas break. Voucher codes will be sent to parents' email address before the end of term. If your child is in Reception/Year 1 or Year 2 and therefore gets a free meal anyway, you may be still eligible so please do apply if you think you meet the criteria below as this will generate pupil premium funding for your child and other extra funding into the school. To be eligible for free school meals you must be in receipt of the following benefits:

- Income support
- Income-based Job Seekers Allowance
- Child Tax Credit, with no Working Tax Credit, with an income below £16,190
- Universal Credit
- Universal Credit and employed – take home pay must be no more than £616.67 per month
- Support under the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999, under section 95

The team at Newstead Abbey have a tale to tell this festive period as Storybook Christmas returns. New for this year is a Christmas legend and a much-loved story - The Nutcracker written by E.T.A. Hoffmann, and used as the basis for the 1892 Tchaikovsky ballet. Be enthralled by stunningly dressed rooms specially dressed to Christmas as you tour the historic house. Each weekend (Sat-Sun), there will also be a craft market in the cloisters with a range of local handmade goods. The craft stalls can be accessed either as part of the Storybook Christmas house tour, or via the shop if you're just visiting the gardens. Nottingham Christmas Market until Fri 31 December Old Market Square. It’s the first weekend for Nottingham’s Christmas Market with lots of fun activities, market stalls, and festive treats to try. Take a trip to the brand-new Christmas Village in Trinity Square and grab a mulled wine or a hot chocolate. Groups will love the cosy igloo-style domes where you can order drinks from the festive menu. In Old Market Square, look down on the magnificent Christmas tree from the 33m high observation wheel, or take a ride on the traditional carousel. If you're worried about crowds, consider visiting midweek. **Woodthorpe Christmas Trees.** Trees available now at Woodthorpe Park Plant Shop. A giant reindeer lights the way to Woodthorpe Park! Choose your Christmas tree either in person or online! Delivery is free within a 10-mile radius when you spend over £30. Trees come in biodegradable netting. You can also buy beautiful home-grown poinsettia in a range of colours, plus cyclamens and chilli plants - perfect for Christmas gifts.

A very Sneinton Christmas. Fri 26 and Sat 27 November Sneinton Market Avenues. This is an alternative Christmas market that is uniquely Sneinton. There will be incredible independent vendors, sustainably sourced décor, and festive artwork, celebrating the best of Sneinton’s diverse heritage and creative community. You can expect artists, makers, musicians, food, and drink. It's all distinctly local and independent. Food and drink is provided by Nottingham Street Food Club (Fri) and Blend. **Christmas at Wollaton.** Fri 26 November 2021 to Sun 9 January 2022, Wollaton Park. Visitors from the previous year were asked to pick their favourite sections to see again. The Deer Park and the Tunnel of Light are back, alongside brand-new installations that will dazzle and astound as you follow the extended trail. Also new for this year is a Christmas Market area with seasonal refreshments on sale and a range of local crafts to buy.
