

# Cantrell Primary School Newsletter 4<sup>th</sup> November 2022



**ATTENDANCE.** Currently at **95.4%** for the academic year so far, slightly above the Ofsted expected standard of 95%. Room for improvement on **lateness** though. Regular attendance means punctual attendance. Arriving on time for school is important as late arrivals are disruptive for the class and can be embarrassing for the child who is late. On average 30 children have arrived late every day this week. Children also miss important information during registration including the plan for the day.

- Gates open at 8:30am
- Classroom doors open at 8:40am
- School starts at 8:50am; register taken by class teacher
- Late arrival is between 8:50am – 9:05am
- Arrival after 9:05am is recorded as unauthorised.

It is essential that your child is at school on time and ready to learn. Any unauthorised absence negatively impacts on our overall attendance figure as well as your child's attendance and achievement levels.

**REMINDER YEAR 5 TRIP TO BEAUMANOR HALL.** Children in year 5 are off to Beaumanor Hall as part of their WW2 topic. They will be taking part in an evacuee experience day. The trip is on **Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> November** and costs £20. Please return consent slip below if you haven't already.

It is important every child has a completed form which states if you would like them to receive the flu vaccination spray or not. 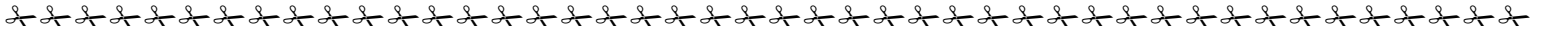
